As much as I have been able I have placed these details on Appendix at the end of the book with a call to the proper page. I realize that lack of information has been the main reason for the Church to remain dormant, but my hope and prayer is that this book will unveil mysteries of the kingdom that will provide the motivation needed for you to get involved, or to become informed, if nothing else. When I make reference to specific denominations and churches to examine their spiritual condition and need, I am always referring to the clergy and leadership in general, and never to individual members, for they do what they are told to do, and believe what they are taught, and are not responsible for erroneous teachings and distortions of doctrine, yet I am also convinced that it is time for the Laity to get involved in
